Vicki Adams Willis

Artistic Director/ Choreographer

Vicki carries on a family tradition which began when her mother, Alice (Murdoch) Adams opened one of the first dance schools in Calgary in the 1920s. Vicki's passion for dance and jazz has taken her literally all over the globe. Besides teaching and choreographing for countless organizations in Alberta and elsewhere (including The School at Jacob's Pillow in Massachusetts), she was founder of the Jazz Division in the Faculty of Fine Arts, Program of Dance at the University of Calgary, founder of Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School, and is founding Artistic Director of the DJD Company. Honours include U of C's Superior Teacher Award and Global Television's Women of Vision Award.

Joanne Baker

Rehearsal Mistress

After spending seven seasons dancing with DJD, Joanne has comfortably settled into her role as company rehearsal mistress. In addition, Joanne is currently DJD's Dance School Principal, conducts workshops for the company, and teaches at the DJD School and other dance schools in the city.

Jean-Kyle Bienvenu

Understudy

At only 19 years of age Jean-Kyle is just beginning his dancing career. It began in Victoria, BC, at age 14 after taking a summer intensive with Tara Birtwistle and Paul De Strooper, of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. After a truly inspiring summer Jean-Kyle figured that a career in dance might just be in order. At 16 Jean-Kyle was accepted into the Banff Centre of the Arts summer training program. That same summer Jean-Kyle attended Jazz Immersion at DJD and found his calling. After graduating from high school Jean-Kyle moved to Calgary to scholarship with the DJD school. This year he was accepted as apprentice, and is loving every minute.

Kimberley Cooper

Dancer/Choreographer

Kimberley Cooper has been a part of the Calgary dance scene since she first became an apprentice dancer with DJD in 1989. In addition to being a full-time company dancer, Kimberley was recently appointed as Resident Choreographer/Artistic Associate. She is a vital part of the independent dance community in Calgary having worked with local choreographers such as Nicole Mion, Laurie Montemurro, Jamie Freeman Cormack, and Tara Wilson.

Her work has been presented by the U of C Program of Dance's Mainstage, Youth Dance Unlimited, Springboard Dance, Alberta Dance Explosions, One Yellow Rabbit, and DJD. Kimberley's first full length piece, *Popular*, premiered at One Yellow Rabbits High Performance Rodeo in January 2002. She looks forward to collaborating with DJD co-founder Hannah Stilwell in DJD's June Show '03 in which the two will co-choreograph/direct. In May of 2002, Cooper was named "Emerging Professional Artist of the Year" by Alberta Dance Alliance.

Jacquie Dawson

Stage Manager

Loungewear marks Jacquie's 4th production as stage manager with DJD. She has spent eight seasons with the Calgary Opera and has managed many productions with Manitoba Theatre Centre, The Banff Centre, Opera Saskatchewan, and The Neptune Theatre in Halifax.

Dancer

After work-shopping, resting, and taking in a few dance shows this past summer, Lori has come back to her second season with DJD renewed and refreshed. Lori's formal training began at Ryerson Polytechnic University in the Theatre-Dance program. After graduating she chose to further explore jazz at the DJD school, where she was on scholarship before being accepted as a company member in 2001. Her most recent contribution to the Calgary arts community is creating a new work for Alberta Dance Explosions (2003), and also remounting her 2002 Explosions piece for Youth Dance Unlimited's 2003 season. *My unending gratitude for all your support, Ryan*.

Lighting Designer

Tammy wears her dancin' shoes to work when she works with DJD and this production is no exception. Dancer




Jaime Marr

Decidedly Jazz Danceworks

HISTORY

The company's trademark respect for and connection to the music has lead many to describe DJD performances as "music for the eyes".

The beginning was a dream shared by Vicki Adams Willis (then founding head of the Jazz Division in the Program of Dance at the University of Calgary) and two of her graduating students, Michèle Moss and Hannah Stilwell.

In 1984 they created Decidedly Jazz Danceworks with the goal of preserving and promoting the rich history and spirit of jazz. The original company had four dancers and an Artistic Director intent on sharing their vision of Jazz with others. Now in its eighteenth year, DJD has carved a niche for itself in the heart of Canada's dance audience. DJD is one of the few professional dance companies world wide with jazz music and dance as it's raison d'etre.

Jazz dance is a North American performing art form with its roots in African and European dance and music. It was born on the streets of America as an Afro-American vernacular social dance form. It is a contemporary dance expression that has evolved and changed drastically over the years through the influence of virtually all dance genres. In its purist form it is deliberately and inherently accessible — in essence, a type of folk dance. It is expressive of human nature, grounded in the emotions of human experience and therefore has a universal appeal. It is sophisticated rhythmically, as well as playful, competitive, soulful and a direct reflection of jazz music.

The DJD style has evolved out of the work of the three company founders. As progressive historians, these

artists are purposefully aware of and connected to the African and historical roots and spirit of jazz, as well as committed to the evolution and future of the form.

Whenever possible DJD incorporates live music into its performances and classes, and has performed with music notables such as Mark Murphy, Big Miller, Tommy Banks, P.J. Perry, Tim White, Jackie Richardson, and Diane Miller as well as with tap notables Buster Brown, Josh Hilberman and Heather Cornell. The company's trademark respect for and connection to the music has lead many to describe DJD performances as "music for the eyes".
