














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## Notes from the ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

#### Everything in its time...

George Koller was living and gigging in Calgary in the early 80's when the seeds of DJD were being sown. At the time, I remember thinking, "If this little company ever finds the means to perform with live music, I want to work with this guy." Well, here it is, over twenty years later, DJD is celebrating its 20th Anniversary, and yes, for the past fifteen years we have managed to create annual dance performances incorporating live music...and finally....finally....we are working with George.

#### Patience is a virtue...

I was feeling completely out of sorts and even a touch panicked when I travelled to Toronto last March. It was meant to be a relaxed creative research trip, a gentle quest for potential future collaborators. However, a few weeks prior to my departure, our best laid plans for DJD's upcoming 20th Anniversary Season completely derailed, leaving me scrambling to come up with a new plan of attack. I had arranged to meet with George while in Toronto, but first I attended an exceptional evening of completely improvised music that he lead at a local Yoga studio. We had a wonderful meeting the next day, and based on my reaction to his music the night before, and the "Take a leap" voice that was whispering in my ear, I asked him if he might be interested in working with DJD "sometime in the future" i.e. IMMEDIATELY...George expressed guarded interest (let's face it, he really had no idea what DJD was all about) but we continued our discussion, moving on to the question of what exactly we would do together. I mentioned that I was reading Michael Ondaatje's In the Skin of a Lion, and was haunted by the words "pivoting echo" found early in the book. The words had set my mind aflutter with images, and I suggested that we might use this as a jumping-off point for the collaboration. But who else should be involved? George mentioned that he often worked with Julie Michels in a bass-vocal duo. Yes, I had a copy of their wonderful Singing Naked CD, and yes, this seemed like a rather appealing option, and well, Julie just happened to have a gig that night that George and I were able to attend, and...well...it was appearing that solutions were flying at me from all directions. George and Julie were more than happy with my suggestion to add a third music maker to the mix, our own Kristian Alexandrov, whose versatility as a musician would provide some important musical elements that I thought would be necessary for the production. And so it evolved from there. We seemed to be on a weeb it of a roll.

Things happen for a reason...

Yup...I'm feeling ever so thankful that our initial 2003/04 season plans cratered!

What goes 'round comes 'round...

**Pivoting Echoes** is about karma, action & reaction, cause & effect and laughing at life while embracing its sorrows. It's also about wonderfully evocative music written and performed by three incredibly gifted musicians in a creative union with a group of remarkably diverse and talented dancers.

What a gift it has been for me to work with this industrious, skillful and positive collection of artists, and what a treat it has been to collaborate choreographically with creative powerhouse Kimberley Cooper. My idea of a good time is, without a doubt, going into a studio with Kim, tossing out some ideas, and watching her blast off.

I took this same opportunity with retired DJD dancer Joanne Baker. Joanne is our Rehearsal Director (one of her many roles) and a stunning dancer. It just seemed time to once again share with our audience the pleasure of watching her dance (something I am able to delight in on a daily basis). She graciously agreed to make a guest appearance in *Pivoting Echoes*, and I invite you to enjoy.

This was a wonderfully satisfying project for me, and I would like to express my deep gratitude to this mighty band of merry artists (including our clever designers) as well as the host of staff and volunteers whose hard work and generosity continue to put the rhythm in our step here at DJD...even 20 years later!



And lastly, kudos to our Board, staff and volunteers for their truly tireless work. May a big "thank you" echo in your jazz-filled hearts for years to come!







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#### **HISTORY**



The beginning was a dream shared by Vicki Adams Willis (then founding head of the Jazz Division in the Program of Dance at the University of Calgary) and two of her graduating students, Michèle Moss and Hannah Stilwell.

In 1984 they created Decidedly Jazz Danceworks with the goal of preserving and promoting the rich history and spirit of jazz. The original company had four dancers and an Artistic Director intent on sharing their vision of Jazz with others. Now in its twentieth year, DJD has carved a niche for itself in the heart of Canada's dance audience. DJD is one of the few professional dance companies in the world with jazz music and dance as it's raison d'etre.

Jazz dance is a North American performing art form with its roots in African and European dance and music. It was born on the streets of America as an Afro-American vernacular social dance form. It is a contemporary dance expression that has evolved and changed drastically over the years through the influence of virtually all dance genres. In its purest form it is deliberately and inherently accessible – in essence, a type of folk dance. It is expressive of human nature, grounded in the emotions of human experience, and therefore has a universal appeal. It is sophisticated rhythmically, as well as playful, competitive, soulful, and a direct reflection of jazz music.

The DJD style has evolved out of the work of the three company founders. As progressive historians, these artists are purposefully aware of and connected to the African and historical roots and spirit of jazz, as well as committed to the evolution and future of the form.

Whenever possible DJD incorporates live music into its performances and classes, and has performed with music notables such as Mark Murphy, Big Miller, Tommy Banks, P.J. Perry, Tim White, Jackie Richardson, and Diane Miller as well as with tap notables Buster Brown, Josh Hilberman and Heather Cornell. The company's trademark respect for and connection to the music has lead many to describe DJD performances as "music for the eyes".

The Calgary based company has toured throughout Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, British Columbia and the Maritimes, as well as to Ottawa, Yellowknife, the Montréal Jazz Festival, Chicago and Japan.

In addition to performing and touring, DJD's mandate includes a strong education component. The Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School has an enrollment of over 1000 students between the ages of 2 and 82 studying Jazz, African, Tap, Modern, Ballet, Hip Hop, Funk, Pilates, Yoga, and Breakin'. In addition, the company does educational performances and residencies, and teaches workshops and master classes in Jazz, Jazz History, Tap, Funk, and African to all ages and levels.



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#### **BIOGRAPHIES**

#### Vicki Adams Willis

Artistic Director/Choreographer

Vicki carries on a family tradition which began when her mother, Alice (Murdoch) Adams opened one of the first dance schools in Calgary in the 1920s. Vicki's passion for dance and jazz has taken her literally all over the globe. Besides teaching and choreographing for countless organizations in Alberta and elsewhere (including

The School at Jacob's Pillow in Massachusetts) she was founder of the Jazz Division in the Faculty of Fine Arts', Program of Dance at the University of Calgary, founder of Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School, and is founding Artistic Director of the DJD company. Honours include U of C's Superior Teacher Award and Global Television's Women of Vision Award.

#### Kristian Alexandrov

Composer, Musician (Drums, Keyboards)

Kristian has music in his blood. Born and raised in Sofia, Bulgaria, he grew up in a family of musicians in an environment rich with world musical influences. Classically trained as a pianist and percussionist, Kristian was able to tour most of Europe by the age of sixteen. It was a natural progression for him to come to Canada in 1995 to continue his musical quest in this cultural mosaic.

In true gypsy style, Kristian returned to Calgary last summer following a year and a half stint in Toronto where he performed alongside swing/jump blues icons Danny B. and Big Rude Jake, as well as jazz crooner Tory Cassis. He was also busy in the studio in Toronto, most recently co-producing and mixing Big Rude Jake's latest CD. DJD's current production, *Pivoting Echoes*, gives Kristian the opportunity to collaborate with fearless Toronto music-makers George Koller and Julie Michels here on Western soil... Talk about karma!

#### Joanne Baker

Rehearsal Director/Guest Artist

After spending seven seasons dancing with DJD, Joanne left Calgary for a Northern adventure with her husband. Since returning in 2001, she has comfortably settled into her role as DJD's Rehearsal Director. Joanne's other roles with the organization include Dance School Principal, Arts in Education Coordinator, and passionate teacher at the DJD School. When she's not planning classes,

developing school programming, or teaching the company, Joanne can be found walking through the beauty of the Foothills with Michael and Kisa. Joanne is honoured to be dancing on stage again with all of those involved with *Pivoting Echoes*.

#### Kimberley Cooper

Dancer/Choreographer

Dancer, choreographer and teacher, Kimberley
Cooper, has been a part of DJD since 1989
when she was first accepted into the company
as an apprentice dancer. She became Artistic
Associate/Resident Choreographer with DJD in
2001, and continues to dance with the company
full time. Kimberley has also danced in many

productions created by local choreographers for both stage and screen. She has choreographed works for the University of Calgary, Springboard Dance, Dancers' Studio West, One Yellow Rabbit, Alberta Dance Alliance, and DJD. In 2002 she was named Emerging Professional Artist of the Year by Alberta Dance Alliance. In 2003 she co-created Velvet (DJD's spring 2003 show) with DJD co-founder Hannah Stilwell. The two are currently working on an exciting project for DJD's 2004/05 season fusing Cuban and Jazz music and dance.

#### Pamela Denis

Apprentice

Pamela discovered her love of dance at the age of three in Lacombe, Alberta. She feels fortunate to have since studied in France, Italy, Spain, Cuba, Boston, Los Angeles, Winnipeg, and Banff. After achieving her Advanced Cecchetti exam and performing with a preprofessional ballet company, she moved to

Calgary to further explore jazz at DJD. She has performed locally in DSW's Alberta Dance Explosions and Calgary Cares. Pamela spent last year at the DJD School training as a scholarship student. She is thrilled to be dancing in her first season as an apprentice with the DJD.

#### Ahmed Fernandez Hodelin

Dancer

A former soloist with Conjunto Folklorico
Nacional de Cuba, Ahmed has been training
as a dancer since elementary school. He spent
seven years at the National School of Arts in
Havana where he was immersed in Cuban as
well as international dance and rhythms. He then

spent two years in a pre-professional program before dancing with Conjunto Folklorico Nacional de Cuba for nine years. He also studied Cuban percussion at the Filix Varela Music Conservatory. Ahmed can now be found teaching Cuban dance in various locations around Calgary. This is his fifth season with DJD.

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Set Designer

Theatre Company, The Black Bonspiel of Wullie MacCrimmon for Thousand Islands Playhouse, Love Letters and Dear Liar for the Atlantic Theatre Festival, and Summer Garden, Earhart, and the Ontario Tours of Peggy and Grace and Dads in Bondage for Lighthouse Festival Theatre. Over the past twenty years, Graham has worked in many different cities across Canada as a designer, production manager and teacher. He is the Production and Tour Manager for DJD.

#### Harry Frehner

Lighting Designer



Since last year, Harry has worked on several exciting projects including: The Requiem 911 Project in Ottawa, a new version of Salome for Arizona Opera and the premiere of Filumena here in Calgary. He has just returned from lighting the musical On the Twentieth Century at the Shaw

The King & I, Guys & Dolls (Citadel Theatre), Christmas Carol, Glass Menagerie (Theatre Calgary), Othello, All's Well That Ends Well (National Arts Centre), and Pygmalion, Uncle Vanya, The Importance of Being Earnest, Macbeth, The Taming of the Shrew, and A Doll's House at the Atlantic Theatre Festival. In addition, Hilary has been Production Stage Manager at the Stratford Festival and the Atlantic Theatre Festival. Her opera credits include La Boheme, Rigoletto, Don Pasquale, Cosi Fan Tutti, and Turandot, (Edmonton Opera).

#### George Koller

Composer, Musician (Bass, Vocals)



George Koller has accumulated hundreds of wildly diverse performing and recording credits in his expansive musical career with The Shuffle Demons, Phil Woods, Peter Gabriel, Loreena McKennitt, Bruce Cockburn, Holly Cole, Ian Tyson, to name only a few.

Recognized primarily as a bass player, George plays a variety of instruments; many featured on his

HMV grand prize award-winning solo CD, Music for Plants, Animals, and Humans. A second release on his ZSAN label with Julie Michels, Singing Naked, received critical acclaim. George has toured the world for eight years with Holly Cole. He has also toured with Julie Michels, Joe Sealy, Carol Welsman, Valdy, and many others. He is presently composing new music (guitar, voice chants), and is appearing on many new recordings. Most recently, he has released a CD for Yoga practice called Internal Arts on which he plays Sitar, Sarode, Tanpura, and the violin-like Dilbruba, He is also touring Canada with Joe Sealy and Cindy Church with their recording The Nearness of You. Born and raised in Edmonton, George has lived in Toronto for the last twenty years. From 1980-83 he lived in Calgary, has fond memories of that time, and is loving being back for a while. Thanks to Vicki and DJD for making it happen!

#### Laura Laycock

Apprentice



Laura didn't always want to be a jazz dancer.

She grew up in Red Deer with the dream of being a ballerina and attended the National Ballet School. It wasn't until she was fourteen when her mom took her to a DJD show that her love of jazz was born.

While attending the University of Calgary, she was also a scholarship student at the DJD School.

In 1998 she performed in an apprentice role in DJD's Classic Jam. Later that year, Laura travelled to Chicago to study with Billy Siegenfeld. With his company, Jump Rhythm Jazz Project, Laura performed nationally and internationally for four years. Laura has now returned home and feels fortunate to be dancing once again with this wonderful jazz company.

#### Dinou Marlett-Stuart

Dancer



After dancing for twelve years in Calgary,
Dinou travelled to England to attend
Performers Dance College. After
completing a three-year degree
programme with 3<sup>rd</sup> year honours, she
continued dancing professionally
throughout England for two years, being cast

returning to Calgary, Dinou has been teaching, as well as producing, dancing in, and choreographing various projects, including Calgary Cares and Alberta Dance Explosions. Receiving a scholarship at the DJD School in 2001, Dinou has been a guest artist in the DJD school show, Live and in Sync and Kimberley Cooper's Popular, understudy for Perched on the Edge of a Quarter Note and full time company member since last season. Dinou is thrilled about this season's prospects.

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#### Julie Michels

Composer, Lyricist, Musician (Vocals)

has choreographed two pieces for the company.

He arrived in Calgary in October and is happy "to be dancing with the best jazz company in Canada. Jazz makes me fly!"

#### Kathryn Pollack

Dancer

Kathryn began dancing in her hometown of Regina.

Her studies took her to Toronto, Winnipeg, and then to Montrèal. Upon graduating from L'École Supèrieure de Danse du Québec, she danced with Le Jeune Ballet du Québec. Returning to Toronto, she danced with Ontario Ballet Theatre from 1994-1997. Kathryn also had the opportunity to

dance with Banff Festival Ballet during the summers of '96 and '97. She joined DJD in the fall of 1997. Since arriving in Calgary, Kathryn has also worked independently as a dancer, choreographer, and teacher in a number of performances, workshops and films. She has travelled to Guinea, West Africa and continues her study of African, Jazz, and Tap annually in New York.

Her work has taken her to Africa, Cuba, Jamaica, India,
