I'm afraid that you will be hard pressed to find a pachyderm in this evening's production, but we do quarantee an abundance of clown energy. Clown work has flavoured and informed my choreography for many years, and with SOUL JUGGLERS I am realizing a long time and often shelved dream of creating a full-evening work which fuses the compelling worlds of jazz and circus.

It has been a treat beyond words to finally be back in the studio working with my beloved 'jazz ducks'. Besides bringing me immeasurable joy, they have contributed tremendously to the creation of SOUL JUGGLERS. From the development of their wonderful individual clown characters, to the huge contributions they have made to the movement vocabulary used in the choreography, to the eruption of spontaneous moments of clown insanity that have become cherished moments in the show, they have indeed given the work its soul. As individuals, they may appear to be normal and well adjusted. but put them into a dance studio together, mention the word 'clown', and total madness ensues. In short, numerous smiles and a great deal of laughter went into the making of SOUL JUGGLERS.

The inspirations for the multitude of elements that have gone into this work seem infinite, and I do want to thank Charles Malinsky for turning my thoughts towards a Timekeeper,- the clowns at the Clown Gallery in London, England for their wonderful generosity,my dear friend Diana Milbank and her fabulous offspring. Lawrence and Georgia, for sticking it out with me through the maze at Longleat, England (two challenging hours 'caught' in the 'world's longest hedge maze'), - Joyce Kelly for sharing her Maui home with me, as well as her love and knowledge of labyrinths- and Hannah, Kathi and Damon for brilliantly holding the fort last year while I was off on my circus maze adventure.

To the small but magnificient staff at Decidedly Jazz Danceworks, to our stellar volunteers and Board of Directors and to the myriad of talented artist who have left their invaluable marks on SOUL JUGGLERS, I feel

eternally grateful.

I dedicate this work to the memory of my extraordinary mother, whose passion for dance remained tucked carefully in her soul throughout her almost ninety years. She was and is a constant reminder for me that to dance is to celebrate life's precious journey.



Vicki carries on a family tradition which began when her mother, Alice (Murdoch) Adams opened one of the first dance schools in Calgary in the 1920's. Vicki's passion for dance and jazz has taken her literally all over the globe. Besides teaching and choreographing for countless organizations in Alberta and elsewhere (including The School at Jacob's Pillow in Massachusetts), she was the founder of the Jazz Division in the Faculty of Fine Arts, Program of Dance at the University of Calgary, founder of the Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School, and is founding Artistic Director of the DJD company.

Drums/Percussion



Born and raised in Sofia, Bulgaria, Kristian was surrounded by and exposed to a variety of "world" musical styles from a very early age. Displaying a natural aptitude and passion for performance and expression he was enrolled in classical piano classes at the age of four. At six years of age he was accepted into the prestigious L. Pipkov School of Music where he completed his musical education, twelve years of intense training as a pianist and percussionist. In the forty-eight years since his professional debut, Tommy Banks has "... done everything a musician could wish for" (Toronto Star). He's the recipient of the Juno Award, the Gemini Award, the Order of Canada (of which he is an Officer), the Alberta Order of Excellence, the Grand Prix du Disques-Canada, several ARIA Awards, and is a member of the Edmonton Cultural Hall of Fame. Musical touring has taken him to the farthest reaches of China, to eastern Europe and to most points in between. He provided musical direction for the ceremonies of the Commonwealth Games, the World University Games, EXPO '86, the XV Olympic Winter Games, and countless television shows. He has produced and/or conducted command performances for Her Majesty the Queen and the Royal Family, and for President Ronald Reagan. His recordings are on Century II Records in Canada, and on Eagle Records in the United States. Mr. Banks was the Musical Director, arranger and composer of original music for DJD's Stolen Moments.

He recorded his first compact disc in September 1997.

Jeremy holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Jazz studies from the University of Calgary. He plays electric quitar and acoustic bass, as well as quitar, percussion and tuba. Besides being an active clinician. teacher, and songwriter, he has appeared on several compact discs. including two with the Earthtones. Jeremy plays a wide variety of music in orchestras, Big Bands and combos and has performed across Canada, in the United States, England, and Australia. This is Jeremy's third production with DJD.


**Shawn Kinley**

## Michèle Moss


Founding Associate Artistic Director


# Sandy Williams Scholarship Studen Dancer

This leads Little One to the centre of the maze



where the most profound challenges and rewards await.

## MAZES AND LABYRINTHS

"Most mazes are just games. Like the Hampton Court maze, or the hedge maze at Longleat...they have many paths, and are meant to confuse, to baffle. They offer too many choices and the walker of these puzzles is never sure which way to go as there are purposely no (clues) at points where the path diverges. These mazes are meant to be exercises for the analytical left brain...They are artificial mysteries. Games.

A labyrinth is a magical unicursal (single path) maze. It is magical in that through the conscious use of the labyrinth, answers to questions can come, spiritual awareness can be enhanced, the path ahead, in the confusion of the labyrinth's convoluted path, can somehow (magically?) become very clear. It's your choice to enter the labyrinth, but once you have, there is only one way to go. . until you ultimately reach your goal-the treasure at the center. All labyrinths are mazes, but not all mazes are labyrinths." (Sig Lonegren: Labyrinths-Ancient Myths and Modern Uses)





he beginning was a dream shared by Vicki Adams Willis (then founding head of the Jazz Division of the Program of Dance at the University of Calgary) and two of her graduating students, Michèle Moss and Hannah Stilwell.

In 1984 they created Decidedly Jazz Danceworks with the goal of preserving and promoting the rich history and spirit of Jazz. The original company had four dancers and an Artistic Director intent on sharing their vision of Jazz with others. Now in its fifteenth year, DJD has carved a niche for itself in the heart of Canada's dance audience. DJD is Canada's only professional dance

company with jazz music and dance as its raison détre.

Jazz dance is a North American performing art form with its roots in African and European dance and music. It was born on the streets of America as an Afro-American vernacular social dance form. It is a contemporary dance expression that has evolved and changed drastically over the years through the influences of virtually all dance genres. In its purest form it is deliberately and inherently accessible - in essence, a type of folk dance. It is expressive of human nature, grounded in the emotions of human experience, and therefore has a universal appeal. It is sophisticated rhythmically, as well as playful, competitive, soulful and a direct reflection of jazz music.

The DJD style has evolved out of the work of the three company founders. As progressive historians, these artists are purposefully aware of and connected to the African and historical roots and spirit of jazz, as well as committed to the evolution and future of the form.


Whenever possible DJD incorporates live music into its performances and classes, and has featured and performed with jazz music notables such as Mark Murphy, Big Miller, Tommy Banks, PJ. Perry and Diane Miller as well as with tap notables Buster Brown and Heather Cornell. The company's trademark respect for and connection to the music has lead many to describe DJD performances as "music for the eyes".

The Calgary -based company has toured throughout Alberta, Saskatchewan, British Columbia and the Maritimes, as well as to Ottawa, Yellowknife, the Montreal Jazz Festival, Chicago and Japan.

In addition to performing and touring, DJD's mandate includes a strong education component. The Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School has an enrollment of over 800 students between the ages of 2 and 72, studying Jazz, African, Tap, Modern, Ballet, East Indian, Flamenco, Funk, Percussion, Pilates, Swing, Steppin', Stretch and Strength, and Yoga. In addition, the company does educational performances and residencies, and teaches workshops and master classes in Jazz, Jazz History, Tap, Funk and African to all ages and levels.






