Welcome to Decidedly Jazz Danceworks' production of Two Way Stretch - an evening of old and new works drawn from DJD's large and ever-growing repertoire.

The two works chosen for completion and "final adornment" from October's works-in-progress concert, DJD Unplugged are Vibes (an ode to that oh so groovy and distinctive '70's approach to jazz) choreographed by Michèle Moss, - and Chakadar Marg (what began as a pure dance solo has evolved into a stunning group piece with much to say to us about hope) - choreographed by Hannah Stilwell.
