




refers to that magical moment between wakefulness and full sleep where we feel ourselves descend into blackness, give up control and surrender to unknown worlds that await us. At this moment, we often have the sensation of falling, and our body's jerking response to this illusion wakes us. We, as choreographers and directors of *Velvet*, tried to ignore our instincts during these velvet moments of the choreographic process and resisted all urges to jerk ourselves back to "reality."

In August of 2001 we proposed a large-scale project to Vicki Adams Willis, Artistic Director of DJD. She readily agreed to hand us the reins of the company of dancers to create something new... but that specific project was not meant to find life just yet (it will, and you will hear more about it very soon...). Nonetheless, Vicki turned to us on another day and said, "Well, we can't to that project next season, but would you consider doing something different in June 2003?" We both nodded yes, and when asked what the new project idea was, we looked at each other and shrugged our shoulders. We had agreed to create a full evening of dance and had no alternative ideas lurking in our minds.

We walked along the riverbank and talked. We clarified a few dreams we shared. Having loved and dedicated ourselves to jazz dance our entire careers, we both felt a need to delve into what we call "the darker side" or "the underbelly" of jazz dance. Jazz is an enormous genre of music, dance, expression and way of life. It was born out of many human experiences, including oppression, racism, cruelty, separation, freedom, celebration, destitution, rebellion, survival, and loves found and lost. We wished to explore some of these experiences in ways we never have before, allowing our dances to maintain the human element while creating worlds that were not necessarily human.

We live and work in Calgary, Alberta, but we never forget the roots of our form. On our day at the river, we reflected on the early period in the evolution of jazz and thought specifically about Storyville. At the turn of the last century, Storyville was the red light district in New Orleans that is often considered the "birthplace" of Jazz music. There lived prostitutes and pimps, of course, but also children, mothers, fathers, cooks, maids, loan sharks and an untold number of individuals. The music was "avant-garde"; jazz was being created in brothels as accompaniment to dramas we can never know about. Musicians from perfectly "upright" families, such as Duke Ellington, made their way to Storyville to be a part of something "new" - to learn, to innovate, to create this distinct expression of the American people.

We base part of **Velvet** in Storyville – the stories are felt, not told, and our characters have dreams and nightmares – in daylight and in darkness.

Slumber, dreams and nightmares have given us "permission" to be unrestrained and brave, to explore "feels" of jazz dance that don't often fit nicely into an evening of work. The non-linear, unexpected nature of dreams gives us room to resist control and tidiness, and challenges us to explore ideas that stretch our boundaries. Here they are, unaltered and naked before you. We hope you will suspend your expectations and fall into the **Velvet** with us. When your ideas of "reality" jerk your body out of the velvet, surrender once again and see what stirs up the night.

Thank you, Vicki, for giving us a green light and your blessings, and thank you the Board and Staff at DJD for their never-ending support. Thank you and a wish of "sweet dreams" to our hard-working artistic collaborators who also agreed to follow us into unknown realms. And, as always, thank you to the dancers for their willingness to "fall."

Vicki carries on a family tradition which began when her mother, Alice (Murdoch) Adams opened one of the first dance schools in Calgary in the 1920s. Vicki's passion for dance and jazz has taken her literally all over the globe. Besides teaching and choreographing for countless organizations in Alberta and elsewhere (including The School at Jacob's Pillow in Massachusetts), she was founder of the Jazz Division in the Faculty of Fine Arts, Program of Dance at the University of Calgary, founder of Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School, and is founding Artistic Director of the DJD company. Honours include U of C's Superior Teacher Award and Global Television's Women of Vision Award.

Kristian Alexandrov

Musical Director/Keyboards

Kristian has music in his blood. Born and raised in Sofia, Bulgaria, he grew up in a family of musicians in an environment rich with world, musical influences. With intense classical training as a pianist and percussionist, Kristian was able to tour most of Europe by the age of sixteen. It was a natural progression for him to come to Canada in 1995 to continue his musical quest in this cultural mosaic. In true gypsy style, Kristian returns to Calgary this summer following a year and a half stint in Toronto where he performed alongside swing/jump blues icons Danny B. and Big Rude Jake, as well as jazz crooner Tory Cassis. He was also busy in the studio in Toronto, most recently co-producing and mixing Big Rude Jake's latest CD. Kristian is excited to be gearing up for the release of Shannon Gaye's new acoustic soul CD *Pretty Pictures*, a collaborative album he co-wrote and co-produced. Happy to be back under the big blue western sky, Kristian looks forward to pushing boundaries in DJD's latest production *Velvet*.

Kimberley Cooper


Artistic Director - Velvet/Choreographer/ Dancer

Jason Stroh


Dancer




Jazz dance is a North American performing art form with its roots in African and European dance and music. It was born on the streets of America as an Afro- American vernacular social dance form. It is a contemporary dance expression that has evolved and changed drastically over the years through the influence of virtually all dance genres. In its purist form it is deliberately and inherently accessible – in essence, a type of folk dance. It is expressive of human nature, grounded in the emotions of human experience and therefore has a universal appeal. It is sophisticated rhythmically, as well as playful, competitive, soulful and a direct reflection of jazz music.

The DJD style has evolved out of the work of the three company founders. As progressive historians, these artists are purposefully aware of and connected to the African and historical roots and spirit of jazz, as well as committed to the evolution and future of the form.

Whenever possible DJD incorporates live music into its performances and classes, and has performed with music notables such as Mark Murphy, Big Miller, Tommy Banks, P.J. Perry, Tim White, Jackie Richardson, and Diane Miller as well as with tap notables Buster Brown, Josh Hilberman and Heather Cornell. The company's trademark respect for and connection to the music has lead many to describe DJD performances as "music for the eyes".

The Calgary based company has toured throughout Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, British Columbia and the Maritimes, as well as to Ottawa, Yellowknife, the Montréal Jazz Festival, Chicago and Japan.

In addition to performing and touring, DJD's mandate includes a strong education component. The Decidedly Jazz Danceworks School has an enrollment of over 950 students between the ages of 2 and 72 studying Jazz, African, Tap, Modern, Ballet, Hip Hop, Salsa, Funk, Pilates, Lindy Hop, Yoga, and Breakin'. In addition, the company does educational performances and residencies, and teaches workshops and master classes in Jazz, Jazz History, Tap, Funk and African to all ages and levels.


