Message from the Artistic Director

We are made of blood and bone, muscle, sinew, grey matter. Complex thinking creatures that can do many things, and things can happen to us. Last season made my heart beat really fast, and hard, it may have taken a year or two off my life, but it was worth it! Rich and full with challenges and adventures. Like an epic jazz tune.

It was an honour to be Artist in Residence at Fall for Dance North, Toronto's premiere dance festival from 2020 to 2022. The grand finale of the residency was the performance of Family of Jazz at the festival last fall. On closing night, our founders were inducted into Dance Collection Danse's Dancers Hall of Fame! The icing on the cake. We closed the season with a tour of that same show, the grand finale of that tour was at Jacob's Pillow in Beckett MA, the mecca of dance in North America, if not the world. To bookend a season like that was monumental, and I'm proud to say we had a standing o' at every performance on tour. We also managed to infiltrate a couple of American universities with our work. It was a season for new audiences, new friends, and breaking new ground internationally.

AND we had our first fully live local season since 2018/19. We took risks in working with, and presenting new artists, as well as celebrating current DJD artists and alumni. It still stops me in my tracks, that we do this, in this beautiful place, with these extraordinary people who are so dedicated to what we do that they go above and beyond, daily. It feels even more precious since 2020, that we continue, and not only continue, but soar above and beyond. We are so lucky, and I am so grateful.

Our 38th season was an epic jazz tune, and, like always, at DJD, when we hear an epic jazz tune, we dance.

Message from the Executive Director

Our 38th season was an incredible journey! Although we find ourselves still in recovery mode from COVID, we kicked the doors wide open, inviting people back into our building for classes, artistic residencies, rehearsals, performances, and rentals. And people responded – we may not be back to pre-pandemic levels in every area yet, but it was a very positive year.

We started and ended our season with the popular hit *Family of Jazz*. In September we did two performances here in Calgary before taking it to Toronto for the Fall for Dance North (FFDN) Festival. Then, to wrap up our season we took it to Quebec, Ottawa, and the prestigious Jacob's Pillow International Dance Festival in Massachusetts where it was performed on the outdoor Henry J. Leir Stage.

While in Toronto for FFDN last fall, another astounding event happened. DJD co-founders Vicki Adams-Willis, Michèle Moss and Hannah Stilwell were inducted into the Dance Collection Danse Hall of Fame. What an honour!

We mounted two other productions in 2023: *OLD/NEW/BORROWED/BLUE* in January, and *Nervous Systems* in April/May. We co-produced E*phemeral Artifacts: Travis Knights* from Toronto's ANANDAM, with One Yellow Rabbit's High Performance Rodeo, and we presented our annual year-end performance by the participants in our Professional Training Program – *Footprints* – in May 26.

The DJD Dance School was in full swing in 2022-23, with 1,288 participants of all ages and abilities. The school is starting to rebound from the disruption of COVID, alongside all our other education and training programs.

I offer my heartfelt gratitude to the board members, other volunteers, staff, artists, technicians and instructors who make DJD such an incredible organization. Enjoy our 2022-23 report and thank you for your support.

Professional Training Program

DJD's Professional Training Program (PTP) was created to foster the development of skilled and knowledgeable jazz dance artists. The Professional Training Program selects 10-15 advanced level dancers from across Canada and beyond to participate in the 8-month program. Our class of 2022/23 included 11 dancers: Maryn Bjorndahl (Calgary), Isabelle Carcamo (Calgary), Annalise Grammacione (Toronto), Allison Hardee (Nashville), Ben Holden (Calgary), J.R. McNeil (St. Louis & Calgary), Lucas Ferrari Pereira (Brazil), Logan Shaffner (Calgary), Lan Tran (Calgary), Sarah Vander Ploeg (Calgary) and Paige Wichers (Lethbridge).

Youth Training Program

Our Youth Training Program (YTP) provides high quality training to youth across several dance genres. DJD's YTP showcases the talents of dedicated instructors who share a passion for dance and believe in educating well-rounded, happy and healthy dance artists. This season 51 young dancers trained through this program from ages 7 to 18.

Classes

DJD is known for creating a welcoming community where everybody can find the joy in dance. Our classes are taught by professional dance educators who passionately share their love of dance with dancers from the ages of 2-92. We have over 50+classes offered from absolute beginner to advanced. This season the number of classes programmed were reduced by 25% of pre-COVID as the demand was not there to increase the number of classes but we are slowly seeing an increase in registrations moving forward.

Summer Camps

DJD summer dance camps are designed to instil a love of dance with an emphasis on fun and celebration, students are encouraged to explore challenges, demonstrate creativity, expand movement vocabulary, build confidence and develop friendships with other students. This summer we had 20 camps throughout July and August. 39 bursaries were awarded to children from low income families through our Send a Kid to Camp program to attend camp free of charge. Additionally, 39 bursaries were awarded to children to attend our Saturday classes throughout the fall and winter.

Karissa Barry Creative Residency

The DJD Dance Centre offers performances, training, outreach, rehearsal, creation and social space for all who enter. The centre has been designed to inspire creativity for the users within and to be a source of creative energy for the district.

Resident Companies

The Centre has 8 resident companies who regularly use our studios for rehearsal or classes. These companies include: Ballet Bodies, Ballet Makarov, Diversity Performing Arts Club of Calgary, National accessArts, SPARQ Productions, Tritone Ensemble, Western Canada Chinese Arts & Culture Association & Maven Movement.

DJD Dance Centre Creative Residency Program

The DJD Dance Centre Creative Residency Program is a program that aims to support independent dance artists in Calgary and nationwide. The residency program has been created to support the research, development, and/or final phase of production for independent choreographers working on specified, self-directed projects that are targeted for production. During the residency, artists have access to one studio at the DJD Dance Centre free of charge for the duration of their residency. This year we awarded 12 Creative Residencies with a total of 57 artists participating in these projects and over 1100 hours of creation and rehearsal time.

DJD Dance Centre Artist in Residency Program

Our DJD Dance Centre Artist in Residency Program is an invitation only program that provides selected artists with space and support for their creative practice. This season Lisa La Touche and Jon McCaslin were invited to join us as our Artists in Residence for their collaborative work Tap, Bass, Drums.

Studio & Theatre Rentals

The centre has been designed to inspire creativity for the users within and to be a source of creative energy for the district. Many individuals and arts groups use our space throughout the year for rehearsals, performances, creation space, workshops and classes. 2022/2023 was our second busiest rental season since the DJD Dance Centre opened. We had 19 groups and 24 independent artists use our studios for creation, rehearsal and class space. 24 groups rented our theatre, holding a total of 50 events and performance throughout the season.

Dancing Parkinson's YYC

This year we celebrated our 10th year of the program which was orginally launched in 2013 as a pilot program by Anne Flynn (Professor Emerita, Dance, University of Calgary) and Vicki Adams Willis (Founder in Residence, DJD) Dancing Parkinson's YYC provides dance classes for people with Parkinson's disease. Research has demonstrated that dancing improves motor and cognitive functions in Parkinson's patients and positively impacts quality of life. With live musical accompaniment and a focus on rhythm, body awareness, muscle development, coordination and socializing, the DPYYC classes have proven to be an uplifting and restorative experience for participants.

Arts in Education

DJD is committed to education, and sharing our love of jazz music and dance with students in schools in a fun and energetic atmosphere. Dance feeds the soul, nourishes the heart, invigorates the body, challenges the mind, builds community and empathy, and puts groove in every step.

One of DJD's long standing residencies with an over 25 year history is our Artist in Residency at Connaught Elementary offering an annual residency for their 500 students with 45 different countries and over 40 languages represented in their student population. Through the generosity of donors we are also able to offer high-needs low income schools with residencies free of charge. This season we had 58 schools in Calgary and area take part in residencies or workshops with a total of 3,774 students participating.

Ontario Outreach

Joanne Baker, our Arts in Education Coordinator works remotely for DJD from Ontario. With her recent relocation to Ontario we have been able to expand our Arts in Education outreach with 4 schools and 175 students participating this season in workshops in Toronto and area.

American Outreach

Kimberley Cooper spent time with the students of the Methodist University in Dallas as a guest artist creating a new piece titled **The Long Way Up** for their dancers that they performed at their spring dance concert. She was invited to be a guest artist at Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo where she taught choreography from **Family of Jazz** which was showcased at WMU Winter Dance Gala and went on to be selected to perform at the American College Dance Association (ACDA) National Festival.




Decidedy Jazz Society (DJD) is a registered charity (118883545 RR0001) with an annual operating budget of \$3.3M.

DJD has a solid record of fiscal responsibility and accountability. Our revenue base is highly diversified: earned & other revenues 53%, fundraising 20% and government grants 27%.


SOURCES OF REVENUE

- In 2023, 20% DJD's revenues came from fundraising revenues (2022-23%), 27% came from operating and project grants (2022 34%) and 21% came from programming revenues (2022 11%)
- Total fundraising and grant revenue contributed 47% to total revenue in 2023 and 51% to total revenue in 2022 (not including Covid related grants in 2022)
- Fundraising & Programming revenues are critical elements in sustaining the organization.



EXPENSES

- Historically, operating costs (general & administration and personnel) have been approximately 38% 49% of DJD's total expenses.
- In 2023, operating costs (Building, Personnel, and General & Administrative) were 52% of total expenses (2022
 –47%).
- Programming expenses have typically been between 27% and 35% of total costs. In 2022, programming costs were 23% of total costs (2022 27%).
